New Start Ministries was incorporated November 13th, 2003 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit. The purpose of NSM is to provide Christian mentoring to DYS youth who volunteer to participate in the activities NSM provides. The first Pen-pal connections made were with 12 youth from the Chalkville Campus on May 7, 2004.

It has been my privilege to continue serving DYS youth in this capacity after retiring from DYS in June 2003. I am thankful that Walter Wood caught the vision for NSM, for his endorsement of the support we provide to DYS youth, and his letters of recommendation to facility directors. I will never forget Walter's statement when we first discussed the idea of NSM serving DYS youth, "*This is exactly what we need to connect DYS youth with the faith-based community.*"

NSM recruits ladies from Christian churches, qualifies them through a background check, and then trains them how to pray, encourage, and be supportive to DYS youth. This training is based on my 25 years of experience in working for DYS in several capacities from dorm supervision, case management, counseling, and administrative supervision of the cottages at the Chalkville Campus, as well as incorporating policies and guidelines from facility directors.

What follows is just a glimpse of what has been accomplished in the past ten years of ministering to DYS youth through hundreds of volunteers serving as Pen-pals to DYS youth. I am looking forward to maintaining favorable partnerships with DYS and Alabama Churches as we endeavor to assist released youth and their families to locate and become a part of a local church in their home communities.


Please use this letter as your introduction to administrators in other facilities to confirm our previous, positive working relationship and our positive recommendation of your ministry's work.

New Start Ministries Additional Ministry Statistics

- From May 7, 2004 to April 11, 2014 NSM has connected 789 youth with Pen-pals for Christian mentoring
- We tried a pilot project with 39 boys at the VACCA Campus, but it was unsuccessful. Neither the boys nor the men were good at writing.
- 2012 was our year of expansion from one program, at the Chalkville Campus, to 6 programs, connecting 125 girls with Pen-pals and giving each girl a Bible
- 2013 was our first year to give every DYS girl sent to the 6 programs we visit with an opportunity to have a Pen-pal and a Bible, with 226 girls out of 238 girls volunteering to participate (95%)
- In 2014 we have connected 46 DYS girls & 10/11 HIT girls with Pen-pals and given each girl a Bible. Only 1 girl has not volunteered to participate thus far this year (98.25% volunteer participation rate)
- Population of the girls changes weekly with new intakes and releases
- In any given week there have been 35 to 68 girls connected with Pen-pals
- 257 men and women have been trained to be Pen-pals
- 78 women are currently active as Pen-pals
- 47 churches and 5 ladies prayer groups have supplied ladies to be Pen-pals
- 18 churches have ladies that are currently active in being Pen-pals
- 16 churches have given a one-time gift to the ministry
- 4 churches support NSM with monthly donations
- 12 individuals/families support NSM with monthly donations
- Our long term goal is to develop a network of volunteer liaisons in each county to follow-up with the girls and their families to help them become involved in a church in the local community

From a Clinical Director:

To whom it may concern:

The services provided by Mr. Valentine are unique to meet the needs of our unique population. Our population is teenage girls in the juvenile justice system. Our girls are involuntary clients and many perceive them as resistant. Yet they willingly respond to Mr. Valentine and the Pen-pal ministry. This ministry allows the girls freedom to choose to communicate. We recognize that emotional needs require an emotional response and spiritual needs require a spiritual response. The girls request prayer to face their fears and are confident that they can ask their Pen-pals questions about their beliefs. They often include encouragement and responses from their Pen-pals in discussion about staying on track when they leave the program. In addition, the letters from Pen-pals are often included as coping skills that the girls request when they are upset. In general, as girls exit the program, they will throw away paper and clutter. However, the letters that provide comfort and hope are carefully stored away.

Thanks for providing this ministry that fights hopelessness and expresses unconditional love; two elements that impact healing and treatment.

It is my perspective that the Pen Pal Program operated by Reverend Walt Valentine is very beneficial to our residents at Troy University Girls Group Home. Our residents benefit from having someone else outside of the facility that they can talk to. When the girls are angry, writing their Pen Pals is used as a stress reduction method because they're expressing their feelings on paper and in turn the Pen Pal writes them back and addresses their issues in the most positive way. In addition some residents have no family members write them at all. Once upon a time these particular residents witnessed others receive mail and it made them feel horrible, but having a Pen Pal assures them that they will receive letters in the mail as well. Pen Pals usually send positive words of encouragement and scriptures that may relate to what they're going through and this too is a tremendous aid in our residents getting to where they need to be to be productive, successful citizens of society. Reverend Valentine has had and continues to have an impeccable impact with his testimonies, optimism, and most of all prayers.

Pen-pal Testimony:

I consider being a pen pal for New Start Ministries an honor. I am reminded in reading letters from the girls how tough this stage of life is. Some of the girls are starting out with the cards stacked against them based on their home life and the things they are exposed to at an early age. They have no way of knowing those things are not normal. I speak from experience. As a teenager and young adult I walked a fine line that should have led me down the road these girls are on. But, Jesus protected me and after many difficult years I answered the Lord's call and accepted him as my Savior.

I think of 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, 4 who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

Again, I am honored to be able to share with these girls what God has done for me and how He can do the same for them. I am blessed through this ministry by being able to pray for and encourage those that I would not otherwise be in contact with.

Pen-pal Testimony (and a letter from a parent):

I got the attached letter [typed in italics below from hand written letter] in the mail recently and it caught me by surprise. It is from the mom of my last pen-pal. She was recently released and is adjusting to being back in the home environment (and still struggling

with choices, it seems). Seeing the note from this mother made me realize the letters we're writing to our pen-pals don't affect only that girl. They affect their roommates who see our cheerful greetings and thoughtful words and they affect the parents who see glimpses of change in their daughters.

It may seem some of our letters fall on empty ears and cold hearts. But if you plant seeds every single week, one day a little bit of hope is bound to grow. Sometimes a girl who has lived a hard life needs to hear repeatedly that she has worth, that she matters to someone, that the choices she makes determine the quality of her relationships and her personal and spiritual health, and that God loves her--before she will ever begin to believe those things could possibly be true about herself.

If there is anything I have learned as a pastor's wife, it's that sudden changes of heart and behavior don't always stick, but it's gradual change in a person who develops over time that is lasting. You might be able to appear different on the outside for a little while, but you can't force yourself to be a better person. You need a lot of help and good influences and people to encourage you to never give up.

This girl is trying, but she's still making mistakes and learning hard lessons. Aren't we all?

I think that's why being a pen-pal is important to me.

Dear Mrs. H.,


